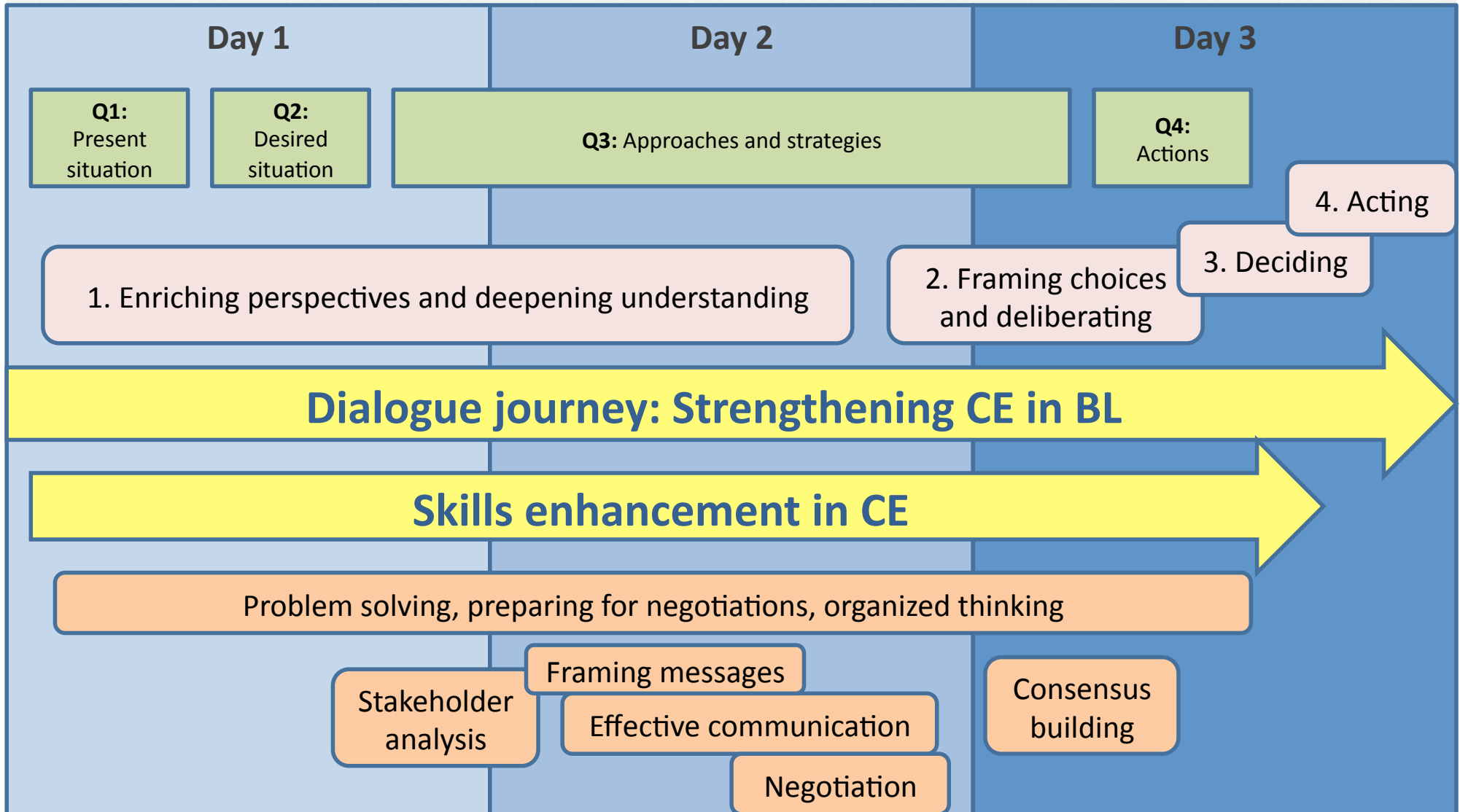

- Plan **actions** to strengthen constructive engagement in BL



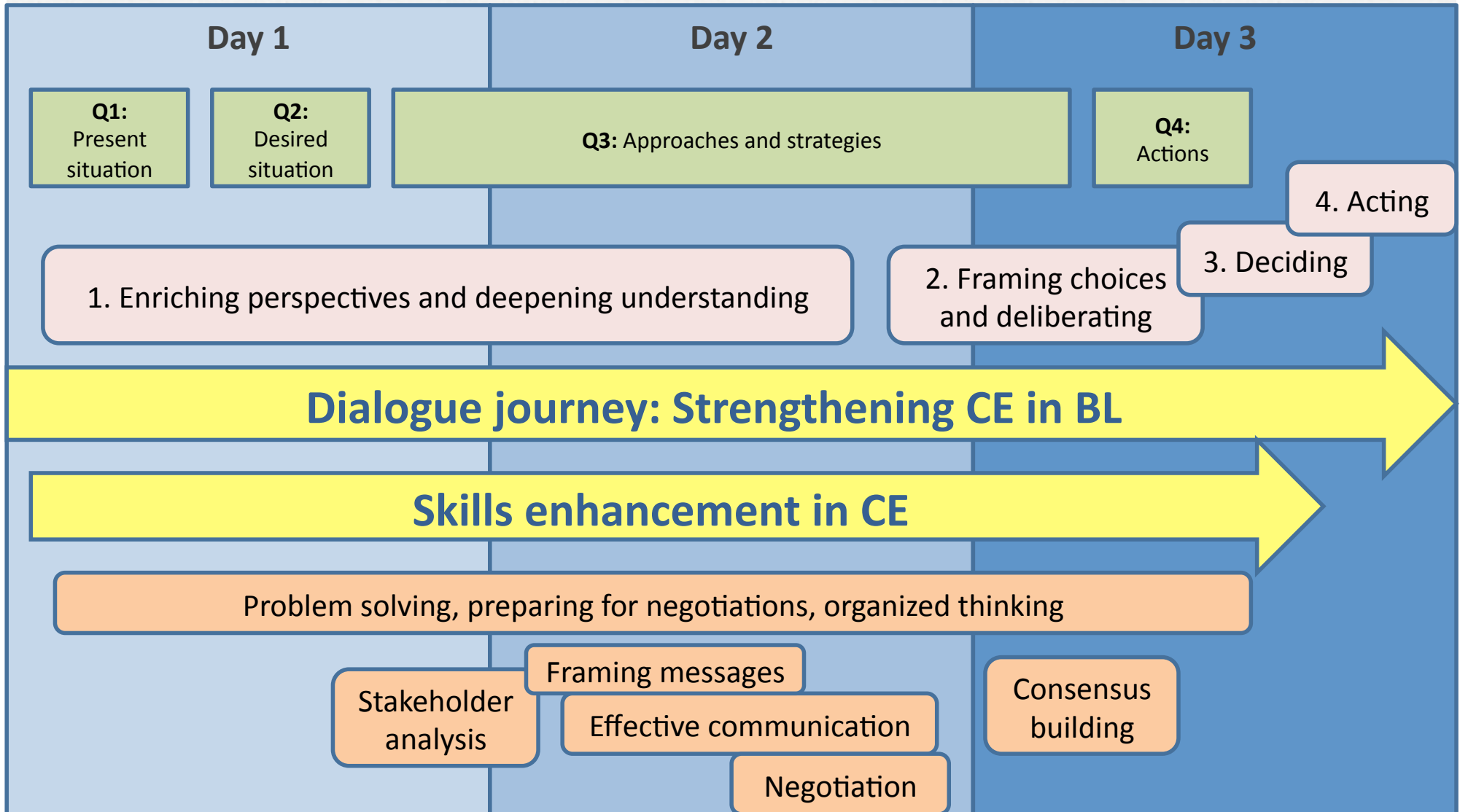
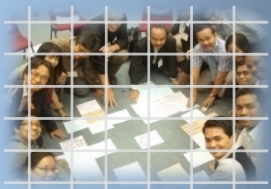


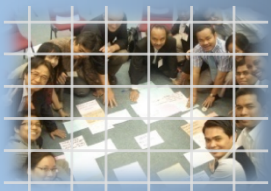
# Our Milestones

- Shared appreciation of skills and tools in CE

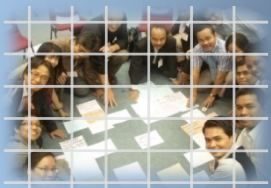




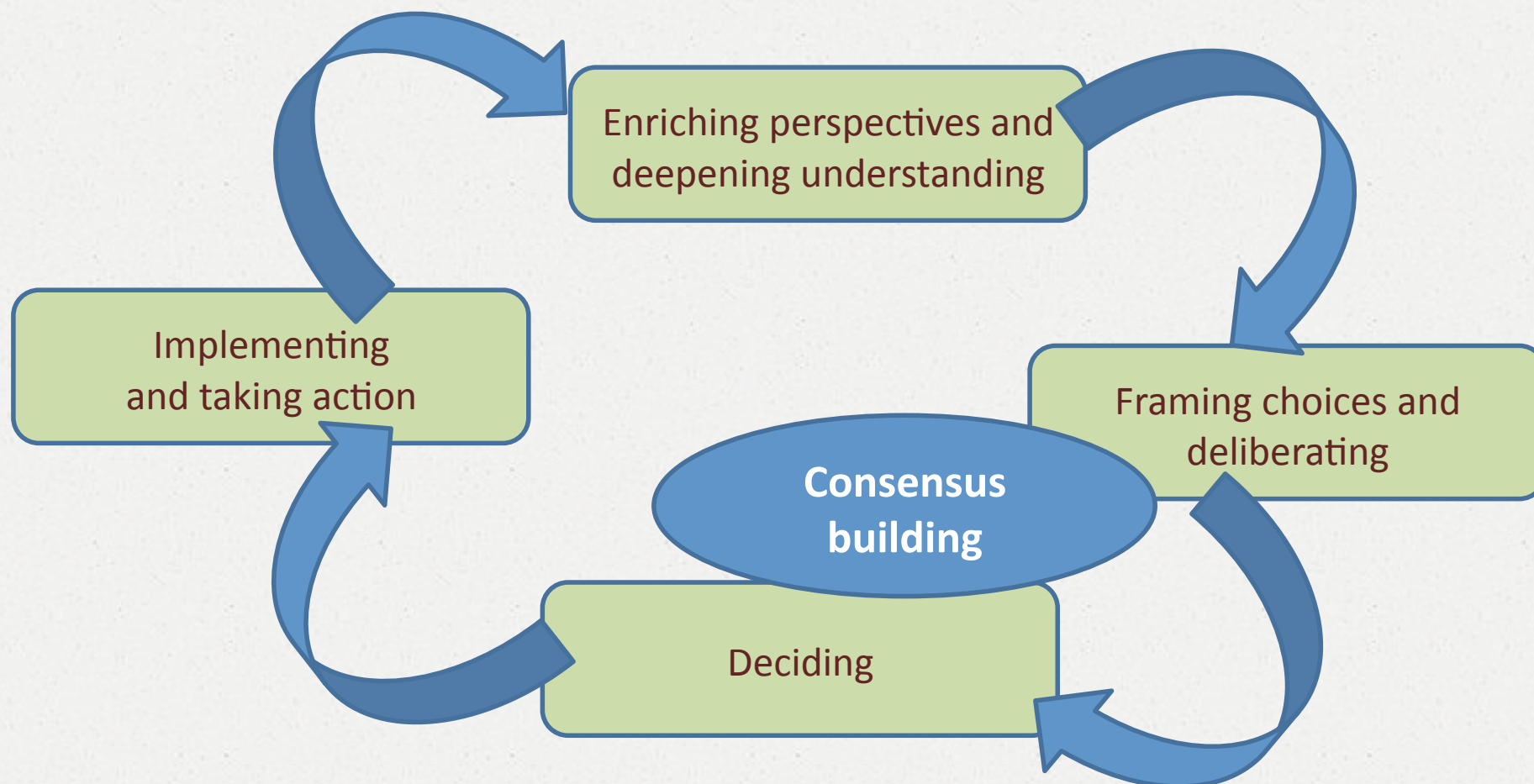
# Consensus building

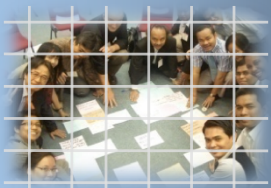


- “Shared thought”
- Dialogue is expanding, while consensus building is narrowing
- Principles:
  - should be inclusive
  - not complete agreement
  - seeking decision with which everyone is comfortable
  - reducing list of options
  - emergence of course of action

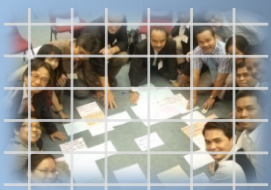




# Value of consensus building



- Coming to a **formal decision** or agreement on the results of our “exploration” in a dialogue
- Helps clarify **core values** behind choices and decision points on alternative paths forward
- Minimizes danger of any **resurgent suspicions or conflicts** resulting from decision process
- Sustains **spirit of dialogue** (as joint inquiry) through the latter stages of decision-making



# Some tips



- Inquiring into nature of disagreements: ranking
  - 4 agree
  - 3 generally agree
  - 2 need more info
  - 1 do not agree
- Agreeing where we disagree
- Ground rules for decision-making process
