- Territory: 1,564,115.75 km2 (19th in the World)
- Location: Central Asia, bordered with Russian Federation and China.
- Capital: Ulaanbaatar city
- Population: Above 2.7 million /April, 2011/
- Government structure: Parliamentary Republic
- Currency: Mongolian Tugrikh /1 USD = 1250 tugriks/

Overview of Public Procurement

May First Public Procurement Law (Law) adopted decentralized system based on UNCITRAL Model Law.

Dec **First Revision of the Law**: Procuring entities became fully responsible and accountable for their procurement decision.

June **Second Revision of the Law**: Public Procurement Agency for centralized large amount procurement was established.


Duties and functions of PPD mandated by Law:

- Public procurement policy;
- Public procurement coordination;
- Procurement monitoring and review;
- Research and analysis related to the public procurement;
- Develop government procurement capacity and professionalism.

Principles of GP

Transparency


- Open and transparent procurement regime
- Procurement objectives,criteria and proceduresmade known to suppliers



Principles of GP

Open and fair competition

- □ Will encourage suppliers to give their best offers
- □ Suppliers are given equitable access opportunities and compete on a level playing field



Principles of GP

Value-for-money

- □ Procure from sources that can best meet its requirements and which offer the best value
- □ Optimal balance of benefits and costs on the basis of total cost of ownership
- □ Does <u>not</u> mean that a tender must be awarded to the lowest bidder.



Procurement methods and threshold

There are three main Procurement methods.

Method		Threshold	
Direct contract		Up to 1 million tugrug	
Comparison (Quotation)	Works	Up to 50 million tugrug	
	Goods	Up to 30 million tugrug	
Tenders	Works	Greater than 50 million tugrug	
	Goods	Greater than 30 million tugrug

Procurement Planning

State Budget is approved by Parliament December 1



Budget administrators approve Procurement Plan December 31



Submit Procurement Plan and Report to MOF before January 15

Complainant can give a complain in three ways.

e-Procurement System of Mongolia

- ❖ The Project on Establishment of e-Procurement System in Mongolia started in October, 2010 (Phase 1).
- * The Implementing Agency: PPD, MOF of Mongolia
- * Component: e-Bidding, e-Shopping mall, e-Catalogue system.
- * Implementation plan of the e-Procurement system:
 - e-Shopping mall will be launched from March 2012
 - e-Bidding will be launched from January 2013

☐ Government will hire CSO to provide monitoring on contract implementation
