- Beta version of Online Civil Society Procurement Monitoring (CSPM) tool (WB-funded)
- Idea first Presented at Athens IACC in 2008
- Forensic lens; red flags approach to PM
- Leverage existing experiences

- 1) Scores and algorithm

- 3) Not all red flags indicate corruption or fraud
- 4) Differences in country and sector contexts, procurement sizes and types
- 5) Difficulties in designing recommendations
- 6) Design something useful and user friendly
