





GOOD GOVERNANCE

A way of decision-making and implementation that aims to achieve desirable and beneficial results for both those who govern and are being governed



GOOD

Something that is desirable and beneficial



GOVERNANCE

- Decision-making process
- DECISIONS ⇒ RESULTS



GOOD GOVERNANCE

... promotes and protects the PUBLIC GOOD/PUBLIC VALUE in a manner essentially FREE OF ABUSE AND CORRUPTION, and with DUE REGARD FOR THE RULE OF LAW



RANSPARENCY

INFORMATION IS...

- Freely available for those who will be affected by decisions
- Adequate, relevant, easily understandable

Decision-making and enforcement follow set rules and regulations, thus make for predictable governance behavior

ACCOUNTABILITY

Powerholders and authority answer for their decisions and actions towards those affected by their decisions and actions

Government officials are responsive to the needs of the citizens from whom their power is derived and subject themselves to monitoring

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Accountability means a system of performance measurement, feedback, grievance, and redress mechanisms are in place and functioning

PARTICIPATION

A PROCESS, not an event, by which stakeholders influence and share control over priority setting, policymaking, resource allocations, and/or program implementation

VOICES of different stakeholders are heard and included in decision-making

Concrete ROLES and CONTRIBUTIONS of the most marginalized and affected groups are integrated into initiatives to improve their conditions

Citizens are free to ASSOCIATE and to CAPACITATE themselves



SELF-MOBILIZATION. *Initiatives taken independently from official institutions*

THE CONTINUUM O

INTERACTIVE. Joint analysis and decisions for actions, monitors, etc.


FUNCTIONAL. Decisions by outsiders, groups form to meet objectives

INCENTIVES. *People work for cash, food, etc.*

CONSULTATION. People answer questions but outsiders define design

INFORMATION. People answer survey questions, but no follow up

PASSIVE. People are told what will happen






Constructive engagement between citizens and government in monitoring government's use of public resources to improve service delivery, protect rights, and promote community welfare.





SOCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY (Key Drivers/Actors)





AT THE INDIVIDUAL LEVEL

• Confidently stating an opinion or idea

ASSERTIVENESS

- Claiming or establishing a right
- Behaving in a way that expresses your <u>confidence</u> and <u>empowerment</u>, and earning you <u>respect</u> as you show respect to all

AT THE ORGANIZATIONAL LEVEL

- Assertiveness is enhanced when citizen groups are organized
- People are "bolder" and feel they have more power when they have the numbers
- Powerholders tend to have more respect when


